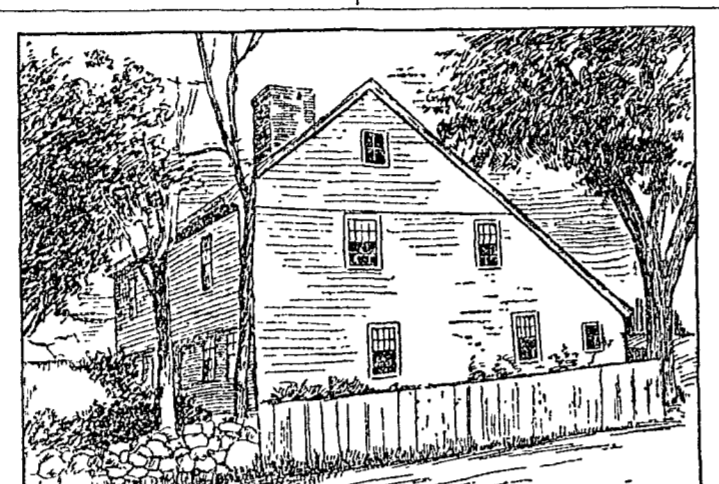


WORN AT THE GRAND PRIX DE PARIS. The Grand Prix gown which was worn at the Grand Prix de Paris, and designed by the artist...
